

China plus One strategy

- The increasing cost of labor (and other inputs) in China has accelerated the number of companies considering this strategy
- Per the requisition from overseas clients who are providing orders in China
- "China plus One " Create one other Asian country to hold down costs or reduce overdependence on China

Why do I see Myanmar as one of ideal plus one country?



- Nay Pyi Taw Capital of Myanmar
- Yangon Old capital at south of Myanmar
- Bago Region next to Yangon
- Mandalay Ancient capital of Myanmar, at the centre part of Myanmar with lots of industries and active Chinese companies
- Existing sea port : Thilawa Port
 Invested by HPH 15 years ago;

- Myanmar has a population of around 60 million, with a workforce estimated at 30 million
- Plenty of unskilled labour available millions in Myanmar aged between
 18-24 actively looking for jobs
- 25% of unemployment rate
- Many skilled workers have moved to Thailand after US sanctions

Sea transportation

- Yangon's ports handle 90% of Myanmar's external trade, and less than 400,000 TEU a year
- Yangon Port: 20-30 km from most industrial parks, handling 80-90% of containerized cargo, with occasional congestion
- Myanmar International Terminal Thilawa (MITT) Set up by Hutchison, operates at int'l standards, yet far below current capacity. It is another 20 km away, it is just adjacent to the Thilawa Special Economic Zone
- Most frequent feeder services from Yangon to Malaysia/Singapore


Background:

- Special Economic Zone (SEZ) development project with active Government participation and support
 - Japanese Government (JICA) &
 - Myanmar Government
- Investment from Japan Private Consortium with 3
 Multi-National Corporations
 - Marubeni Corp.
 - Mitsubishi Corp.
 - Sumitomo Corp.
- Investment from Myanmar Private Consortium made up of 9 Public Companies

Thilawa Special Economic Zone

- The first phase of construction and expected to become operational for manufacturing by 2015.
- Aim to dedicate the free zone 100% to manufacturing, to draw industries focused on export process. The promotion zone will facilitate both manufacturing and service industries
- Expects Thilawa to create nearly 200,000 jobs and double foreign investment in the 2014-15 fiscal year.
- Total 2,400 acres, 1st phase 400 acres, HK Industrial Zone takes up 100 acres.




i-Land located alongside the Yagon - Naypyidaw - Mandalay hightway, 15 mins to Myanmar's biggest New Airport, good potential for investment




